and
Mustn't

Must

Must is a modal verb that we use in a sentence to show that the action is very important to happen. And it shows that the action is obligatory.



How to use must is a
sentence

Subject + **must** + verb.



Examples



You **must** raise your hand to speak.



You **must** study hard if you want to pass your exams.



You **must** listen to the teacher.



You **must** bring your books to school every day.

Mustn't

The negative form of **must** is mustn't.

We use **mustn't** to show that we don't have to do the action.



How to use mustn't is a sentence

Subject + **mustn't** + verb.



Examples



You Mustn't sleep
in class.



You Mustn't play
in class.



You Mustn't bully
your classmates.



You Mustn't forget
your homework.

The verb that comes after must/
mustn't is infinitive. (we add
nothing to the verb).
