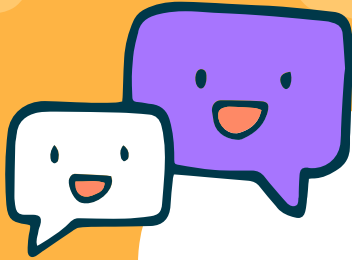


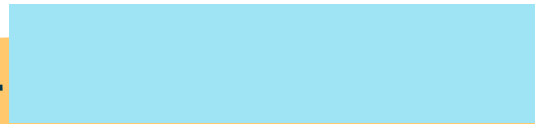

What is a relative clause?

- It is a part of a sentence.
- It has a relative pronoun (who/ which/ where/ when/ whose)
- It describes nouns.
- Tells us what person, animal, thing, place or time the speaker is talking about.

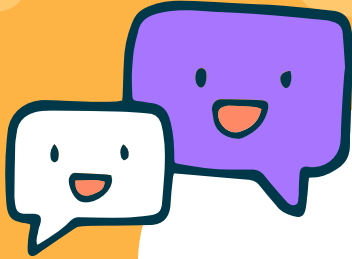

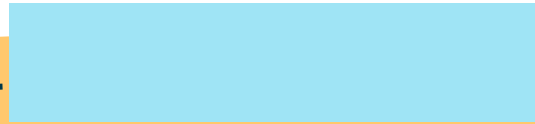

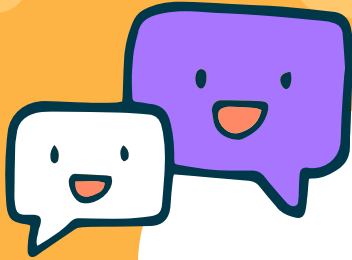
