

### What do we mean by "quantity" and "quantifier"?

#### a. The word quantity basically means amount.

### b. Therefore, quantifiers are words that refer to

#### a quantity or amount but not a specific number





Nouns are names of people, places and things.

There are two types of nouns:



-They refer to nouns that <u>can be</u> <u>counted</u>.

-They have both singular and plural forms.

-E.g. : Apples, children, cookies.



#### -They refer to:

- 1. <u>Concepts or ideas</u>, like hunger and love.
- Things that are made up of <u>parts</u> <u>that are either too small</u>, <u>or too</u> <u>numerous to count</u>. For example: air, sugar, coffee...

### **03** Examples on Quantifiers:

#### Many

- We use **many** with
- 1. Plural Countable Nouns
- 2. Questions
- 3. Negative Statements

Many indicates large quantities.

 Are there many <u>cupcakes</u> left in the plate?
There are<u>n't many oranges</u> in

the bowl

Much We use **much** with: 1. Questions 2. Uncountable Nouns 3. Negative Statements Much indicates large quantities. 1. Is there much milk left in the cup? 2. There is<u>n't much salt</u> in the shaker.

**Examples on Quantifiers:** A lot of Plenty of We use **a** lot of with: We use **plenty of** with: 1. Countable & Uncountable Nouns 1. Countable & UNCountable Nouns 2. Questions 2. ## **03** Examples on Quantifiers:

### A little

We use a little with 1. <u>Uncountable</u> Nouns. 2. <u>Positive</u> statements.

A little indicates small quantities. (some)

There is a little <u>coffee</u> left in your mug. You should

drink it!

We use **a few** with **1. <u>Countable</u>** Nouns. **2. <u>Positive</u>** statements.

A few

A few indicates small quantities. (some)

There are a few pancakes left from this morning. I'm saving them for my sister.

### **03** Examples on Quantifiers:

Little

We use little with 1. <u>Uncountable</u> Nouns 2. <u>Positive</u> statements.

Little indicates small quantities. (not much)

There is little water left in the bottle.

We use **few** with: **1. <u>Countable</u>** Nouns. **2. <u>Positive</u>** statements.

Few

**Few** indicates small quantities. (not many)

There are few <u>marshmallows</u> in the jar.

### 04 How do we use Quantifiers?

We use different quantifiers in different situations based on the following:



- 1- Is the <u>noun</u> we are talking about <u>countable</u> or <u>uncountable</u>?
- 2- Is the <u>sentence</u> a <u>question</u> or a <u>statement</u>?
- 3- Is the <u>sentence</u> in the <u>positive</u> or <u>negative</u> form?
