Present Perfect + for/since



A verb is a word used to describe an <u>action</u> or something <u>we do</u>.

Examples: be, beat, become, begin, build, cast, catch, choose, come, dig, do, dream, drive, fall, feel, fight, get, give, go, have, hear, hide, keep, know, lay, make, pay, put, talk, teach, read, swim, stand...etc. What is the Present Perfect + for/ since? When do we use the Present Perfect tense?



We use the Present Perfect to talk about experiences/ events that happened in the past, but we don't know exactly when they occurred. And are still true until now. We add for or since to say for how long something has been true.


Examples

- Sheila is exhausted! She has sung non-stop for three hours.
 They have lived in London since
 - 2012.
- I have studied for 6 hours.
 He has been in this school since 2019.

The difference between for and since.

For a period of time e.g.: I have been here <u>for</u> 3 weeks

Since beginning of a period of time e.g.: I have been here <u>since</u> March



What is the past participle?

The past participle or **VB** is basically a form of the verb that is added to verb tenses after a helping verb like "has\have" to show a specific meaning.
