Word or Phrase	Part of Speech	Meaning
Detective	Noun	A person, especially a police officer, whose occupation is to investigate and solve crimes.
Tiny	Adjective	Very small.
Binoculars	Noun	An optical instrument with a lens for each eye, used for viewing distant objects.
Flutter	Verb	Fly unsteadily.
Aboriginal	Adjective	Original inhabitants of Australia from earliest times.
Historians	Noun	People who write history.
Anecdote	Noun	A short story about a real person or an event you have experienced.
Gossip	Noun	A casual conversation about other people, typically involving details that are not confirmed as being true.
Cushion	Noun	A bag of cloth stuffed with a mass of soft material, used as a comfortable support for sitting or leaning on.
Out of sight	Phrase	Can't be seen or not visible.
Loop	Noun	A shape produced by a curve that bends round and crosses itself.
Uncoil	Verb	Straighten from a curled position.
Resume	Verb	Continue.
Innocent	Adjective	Not guilty.
Granite	Noun	A very hard rock.
Homesick	Adjective	Experiencing a longing for one's home during a period of absence from it.
Consequence	Noun	A result or effect, typically one that is unwelcome or unpleasant.
Hamper	Noun	A basket with a carrying handle and a hinged lid.
Extinct	Adjective	(Of a volcano) not having erupted in recorded history.
Footstool	Noun	A low stool for resting the feet on when sitting.
Echo	Noun	A sound caused by the reflection of sound waves from a surface back to the listener.
