
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	Word	Part of Speech	Meaning
しい	Toga	Noun	A piece of clothing worn by people in ancient Rome, consisting of a long piece of cloth wrapped around the body and hanging loosely from the shoulders.
	Tunic	Noun	A loose piece of clothing that covers the top part of your body.
V	Chariot	Noun	A vehicle with two wheels that was used in races and fights in ancient times and was pulled by a horse.
V	Merchant	Noun	Someone whose job is buying and selling goods, usually in large amounts.
V	Engineer	Noun	Someone whose job is to design, build, or repair machines, engines, roads, bridges, etc.
V	Villa	Noun	A large house, especially one used for holidays in a warm country.
シンシ	Gladiator	Noun	In ancient Rome, a man who fought another man or an animal, usually until one of them died, for public entertainment.
